John Roberts will discuss the research which he has been conducting on Sharp-shinned Hawks. His talk will be accompanied by slides. A continuous program of banding and observation of Sharp-shinned Hawks is being carried out at the Point Pelee Bird Observatory from September 12 until October 17 by John Roberts, 62 Inglewood Dr., Toronto (481-0180)..
