The June Meeting this year will be held June 10 th., at Luther Marsh. You are requested to meet at the Dam at 10 am. Sharps

The general outline for the day will be banding from canoes and to band nestlings if at all possible. The marsh abounds with many species of ducks also Wilson's Phalaropes and Ospreys, to mention a few. There is also a Heronry, so a profitable day should be had by all. Bring food enough for all day, as weather permitting, activities may last until dusk.

As he is organizing the outing, it will be necessary for him to know how many people (and canoes) will be attending. Anyone who has a canoe is asked to please bring it along.

This should be a most enjoyable day and members are urged to attend, as it will be the last meeting until September.

The Dam is at the NE corner of Luther Lake and may be reached by a concession road south of Monticello (about 2 miles and the Dam is on the right hand side). Monticello is approximately 4 miles south of Hwy 89, and east of Mount Forest. Members coming from Toronto along Hwy 9 via Orangeville, turn right about 4 miles before Arthur. Continue N along the concession road about 8 miles (through Damascus) the turn E (right) to Monticello.

I am sorry I don't have numbers to give of the concession roads, but a good road map will probably be easier to follow anyway!
