LONG POINT BIRD OBSERVATORY

LPBO WARDEN

Applications are invited for the position of Warden at the Long Point Bird Observatory for the 1971 season. The period to be covered is from April 1 to October 31, but it is realised that a suitably qualified person may not be available for the entire period. Applications and inquiries are invited from persons available for a substantial portion of this time. Remuneration will be up to \$325.00 per month, depending on qualifications. Duties will include observational work and banding during the migrational seasons, and studies of breeding birds during the summer, with the help of the LPBO members and other cooperators and also routine maintenance of the facilities of the Observatory at all seasons. A university student in biology, with banding experience would be suitable for this job, but applications will be considered from anyone who feels that he is adequately qualified.

Upland Plover - band no. 813-10889 banded near Alexandria in eastern Ontario on June 7, 1968 as a breeding adult. Shot at Quixada, Ceara, Brazil, 4°50'S 39°10'W in Feb. 1969

Robin - band no. 562-87702 banded in Toronto on May 29, 1965 as a nestling found injured 3 miles west of Houston, Mississippi on Dec. 30, 1965.

Saw-whet Owl - band no. 653-20012 banded in Toronto on 19 April 1967 as an adult. Found dead by Oswegachie River, New York on 24 June 1970.
